By the time you receive this edition of the Promoter, it will officially be winter. What that means in Oklahoma is that it could be a balmy seventy degrees or it could be ice or snow or both and a freezing north wind. It seems that the older I get the less I enjoy winter. Some cold days I wear several layers of clothing and a heavy coat only to go outside for a few seconds come back inside and complain that I must surely have frostbite.

My favorite winter memories come from early childhood. My first years of elementary school were in Mountain Grove, Missouri. When a good snow would come, not only did we get a day off from school but the neighborhood kids would meet up after breakfast and take our steel railed sleds to the closest hill and play until our moms forced us to come inside and warm up. I don't even remember feeling the cold back then. I have seen some of those same hills when visiting as an adult and I have to say that they sure seemed a lot bigger when I was small. Back then they were enormous monstrosities that would literally take my breath away.

Later, in my early teen years we had moved to Wenatchee, Washington. It is a beautiful place surrounded by mountains. In the winter we would have weeks of thick snow. School was rarely called off but there was always plenty of time to enjoy outside activities. In that area instead of steel railed sleds we used an all wood sled called a toboggan. The terrain of the area allowed for much longer and faster rides. It



was exhilarating. I loved being outside and again barely noticed the freezing temperatures. I haven't been back to Wenatchee in many years but I am pretty sure that if I were to visit those tobogganing hills again my reaction would not be surprise at how small the runs were but rather surprise that I was lucky enough to zip down those tree studded runs without killing my crazy self.

I may not enjoy the cold weather like I did when I was younger but I still love a good snow. Sometimes even here in Oklahoma during the winter I will wake up to look out my window to see everything blanketed in snow. It is beautiful. When I venture outside on those snow-covered days I am always reminded of the verse from Isaiah chapter one. Come now, and let us reason together, saith the Lord: though your sins be as scarlet, they shall be as white as snow; though they be red like crimson, they shall be as wool.

There are people all around us every day who need the cleansing of sin by our Savior.

May we be about the business of leading them to him no matter the weather. My prayer is that on the days that I would rather just build a fire in the fireplace and stay inside that I can remind myself that there is sowing, watering and reaping that needs to be done even on the cold days.

Proverbs 20:4 says The sluggard will not plow by reason of the cold; therefore shall he beg in harvest, and have nothing.

May even the cold days of winter remind us that there is much work to be done for His glory!


