Missions Training is Key

Steve & Lori Torrison talk about CIT

"I have already been through a four-year program focused on missions, why do I need to go to a 4-week program? What on earth are they going to be able to teach me that I don't already know?" This was my response 20 years ago when IM told us that we needed to attend a pre-field training program as part of our final preparations to depart for the mission field.

Since arriving to join the facilitator team at CIT (Center for Intercultural Training), I have heard this same sentiment over and over again. "I am a seminary grad," or, "I just studied this, why should I even be here?" Most of those that come through our doors are required to be here by their agencies, just as IM requires our new field workers to attend CIT.

What is CIT, then? And what is the benefit of sending our IM missionaries through the program? To quote Inigo Montoya from The Princess Bride... "Let me explain. No, wait, there is too much; let me sum up."

CIT itself has 3 overall reaches into the world of intercultural training: CIT Next, CIT Global, and CIT Residential. CIT Next is online training for those already on the field who discover a need for more training. These modules are a wonderful resource for global workers and missionaries as they encounter new circumstances or unexpected situations, helping them make the most of every opportunity to reach those who need the Gospel.

CIT Global is the international arm of our program. Most foreignborn missionaries do not have the



means or opportunity to travel to North Carolina or may not know enough English to get the most out of the training. CIT Global works in various regions of the world where we offer training in their own language, including Cuba where I was able to go and provide training in Spanish this past March.

CIT Residential is the main focus of our ministry and is what Lori and I are a part of everyday. There are 5 modules that are currently offered several times each year. We and other veteran missionaries cover topics that are not merely academic and provide practical insights to help participants succeed in missionary life. How do you balance your personal spiritual life, deal with cultural differences, interact with team members, make sure your family is cared for and safe, maintain report with supporters, deal with the loss or sickness of a loved one from 3,000 miles away? All while trying to function and survive in a new language and without the support system of the home church, family, and friends you have come to rely on your whole life. And we haven't even gotten to how I build trust and relationship to gain an ear for sharing the Gospel!

Just like me after we attended

our training 20 years ago, everyone who comes through says, "Wow. There is so much I didn't know. I am SO GLAD I came!" So, why CIT? Better yet, why NOT CIT?? When you partner with us either directly or through OKIM, pray for us, our family, and our ministry, you are a part of reaching into the lives of our IM missionaries and many others, to reach countless people with the Gospel of Christ. Thank you so much!

Fall Enrollment Update

For the fall 2023 semester a total of 293 students are enrolled at Randall University. This number represents a 13% increase from the 275 students that were enrolled last fall semester.


These numbers include 263 undergraduate degreeseeking students, 35 online students at the Moore campus, 39 students at the El Camino, California teaching site, 16 dual enrollment students, 92 residents, and 16 graduate students. Full-time equivalency (FTE) is at 242 students. Randall continues to have a significant international student ministry as 31 International Students comprising 10 countries are represented.

"We are currently enjoying our largest incoming freshmen class, since COVID-19," said Dr. Brent Sykes, Academic Dean. He continued, "The energy on campus is palatable and our administrators, faculty, and staff have a renewed energy as a result of God's provision of students. We are now focusing on retention by presenting the Gospel through mentoring and



community-living so that we can impact and transform students' academic experiences at Randall."
