

#### Rev. Havner Lile Reid Jr.

July 25, 1949 - September 2, 2022



Bro. Havner called by many J. R. was born in Okemah and was raised in the Weleetka area. He graduated from Weleetka High School in 1966. He would

then serve our country in the Viet Nam Conflict in the U.S. Army. He married long-time sweetheart, Anita Carol Redford. While still serving in the Army they made their home in Fort Riley, Kansas and spent 3 years in Germany. Following his discharge they returned to raise two daughters in Wewoka, Oklahoma. After 45 years of marriage, Anita preceded him in death. Bro. J. R. received his Bachelor of Arts degree in Social work and worked for the Oklahoma department of Human Services where he retired in 2015. He was a Free Will Baptist minister here in Oklahoma and for 24 years served as pastor for the Earlsboro Free Will Baptist Church until his death.

#### Dr. Milburn Wilson

Bro. Milburn was born in Cedar Grove to Rev. Muril and Jewel (Lee) Wilson. He graduated as Valedictorian of his class from Francis High School. He

July 2, 1938 – February 13, 2023


Bro. Carl was born in Lindsey, Oklahoma. He graduated from Capitol Hill High School in Oklahoma City in 1955. He married

# Some things are just so good you have to tell somebody

Have you ever had something happen so good and so exciting that you just couldn't wait to tell somebody?

I remember the days before cell phones when something great would take place. Maybe it was an unexpected blessing or perhaps on a pastoral visit when someone accepted Christ. I couldn't wait to get home to tell my wife what had happened. Now I don't have to wait I call immediately.

Once I was told that a large financial gift would be given to the church I was pastoring but was asked not to tell anyone until it was given. I did as I was asked but thought that I would explode because it was such exciting news. I wanted to tell somebody.

I have always found it interesting that on several occasions when Jesus would perform a great miracle the recipient of the miracle was told to tell no one. But in most cases we are told that they went and told everyone.

In Mark 7:32-37 Jesus heals a man who couldn't hear or speak. Jesus opened his ears and healed his tongue. Jesus charged those gathered to tell no one. But the Scripture goes on to say, "but the more he charged them, the more zealously they proclaimed it." Sometimes some things

are just so good that you have to tell somebody.

In Luke 5:12-16 Jesus heals a man with leprosy. Again this man was told to go show himself to the priest but was also commanded to tell no one. This passage also lets us know that the report of the miracle was spread abroad. Sometimes things are just so good that you have to tell somebody.

The raising of Jairus' daughter is found in Matthew, Mark and Luke with the most details in Luke chapter 8. In Luke we see that Jesus charged them to tell no one of the miracle. But Matthew lets us know in 9:26 that the report

went throughout the region. It was just so good that they had to tell somebody.

At the miracle of the demons being cast out of Legion in Luke chapter 8, Jesus finally tells that man, "Return to your house and shew how great things God has done to you". He did exactly that. He went and published throughout the whole city what God had done for him. What Jesus had done for him was so good that he just had to tell somebody.

Has God done anything great in your life? Have you accepted that Jesus death on the cross was for your sins?

Have you believed that He rose from the dead to declare that He is indeed the Son of God and believed that the power that raised Him from the dead is available to give you new life in Him?

Has He saved you from the punishment of Hell?

> Has He prepared a place in Heaven for you?

> > Is He coming again to receive us just like He promised?

If you answer yes to these questions, wouldn't you agree that this is so good that

we cannot be quiet about it.

The Gospel is so good that we just have to tell somebody. Actually, it is so good that we just have to tell **EVERYBODY!**
